

Jackson Talented and Gifted Program Hosts Thrilling Shark Tank Project at Switlik Elementary School!



The goal was not only to foster entrepreneurial skills but also to encourage problem-solving, public speaking, and teamwork - essential skills that will benefit the students for years to come. Mrs. Magee, one of the lead advisors for the project, explained, "This project is designed to give our students a real-world experience in business and entrepreneurship. It's a fun, engaging way to learn about the process of turning an idea into a product, while also building their confidence and public speaking skills."



One aspect of a Student Assistance Coordinator (SAC) is intervention and prevention of substance use. This is exactly what Goetz Middle School Student Assistant Coordinator Stacey Fisk does so passionately as it's such a serious topic in all schools throughout the country. Back on Thursday November 17, 2024 the DART Coalition of Ocean County, Institute for Prevention and Recovery, came to Goetz to train a select group of students on many topics.

The Coalition focuses on preventing underage drinking, prescription drug abuse and the illegal use of marijuana and tobacco and vaping in Ocean County. The coalition helps to train and advise our students on these topics. DART (YPC) used many team building activities to share information with our students as well as to assist the peer leaders with getting comfortable enough with themselves, to then be able to work assisting their peers with any issues that might come up during the school day and need attention.

DART facilitators, along with advisor/SAC Stacey Fisk collaborated with the Goetz National Junior Honor Society, YPC members and peer leaders on many topics including vaping and tobacco use. The central focus is helping to educate, prevent and stomp out smoking, vaping and all other forms of substance use. Our YPC members have written, created and filmed several PSA's for our school to view on Goetz live. We are all working together to "stomp out" these issues.


