<b>Kindergarten</b>	<p>Listen and watch the story <a href="#">Digger the Dinosaur</a> on <a href="#">Tumblebooks</a>. (Do a “TumbleSearch” in the upper right corner of the screen.)</p> <p><b>Answer this question:</b> What are some rhyming word pairs you heard in the story? Can you name some more rhyming words?</p>	<p>These are some <i>optional</i> activities for your child:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Go to <a href="#">PebbleGo</a>. (username: <b>engaged</b> password: <b>learning</b>)</li> <li>2. Click on the link that says “Animals” with a picture of a lion.</li> <li>3. Next click on the picture of a Tyrannosaurus Rex with the word “Dinosaurs.” Learn about different dinosaurs.</li> <li>4. Print out an activity to label the parts of one kind of dinosaur you learn about. Or draw your own picture of a dinosaur!</li> <li>5. Check out more facts when you click the purple “Dinosaurs” link on the main PebbleGo screen.</li> </ol>

Visit <a href="#">BrainPop Jr.</a> and watch the “Classifying Animals” video clip. (No login needed.) When finished, take the easy quiz to test your comprehension.</li> </ol>
