Summer Reading Challenge: Read at least 5 books!

- 2. Enter your books on the Summer Reading Google Form.
- 3. Write your books on any piece of paper you have at home, put your name on it, and bring it to school in September.

- Take any paper you have in your house-loose leaf paper, notebook paper, construction paper, scrap paper-- and write your name on the top.
- Then, every time you read a book, write down the title and the author. And make an emoji face to show how you liked it!
- Keep your paper safe all summer and bring it to school in September.

- Books that you have at home that you love-- reread them!
- Borrow books from a sibling, cousin, neighbor, or friend.
- Try reading magazines, comic books, graphic novels.

Read ebooks by logging in to <u>Epic!</u> with Ms. Schadl's class code-- **rpy9578**.
