


## ABOUT US



## CURRICULUM

#### Math

We use the enVision math series. There is a heavy focus on addition & subtraction strategies. We will work up to three-digit addition and subtraction, so mastery of basic facts is key to success.


#### Reading

Science & Social Studies units alternate throughout the year. We try to align topics with what we are learning in literacy for deeper learning. Hands on activies are in every unit.



#### Notes and Reminders:

Students will get a homework sheet each week. They are responsible for writing down the math homework each morning. Please keep it in their red folder for the entire week.

Reading homework is just to read nightly for 20 minutes. We do not have a reading log and just go on the honor system. Please help your child by setting aside a designated time to read each day.

The bottom of the sheet includes reminders for upcoming events.

## GRADING

- Our school year is split into trimesters, so students will receive a report card 3 times per year.
- We use standards based grading, so students will receive a score of 1, 2, 3, or 4 for each standard. Some standards may be marked with 'NE' during the first and second trimesters.
- 1 Below Standard
- · 2 Approaching Standard (not all material may have been taught)
- · 3 Meets Standard (this is the END OF YEAR goal)
- · 4 Above Standard

# LUNCH



#### General Info

Our lunch is at 10:40 am. We do not have a separate snack time.

Students may bring a packed lunch or purchase lunch and/or snacks in the cafeteria.

Students need their ID cards to purchase lunch and snacks. Money can be added to their lunch accounts online or by sending money to school.
