## **Scheduling Procedures for Incoming 9th Grade Students**

- 1. Parent Orientation meeting held in November to review high school program.
- 2. Presentation to 8<sup>th</sup> grade students in December to introduce students to the Academies and R.O.T.C.
- 3. High School counselor meets with students to review courses, programs, graduation requirements and scheduling process in February and March.
- 4. Jackson Academy applications (Digital Media, Business, STEM, JAA) notifications to students begin in March.
- 5. Students select World Language, two elective courses and two alternative courses on "Course Selection Sheets" and return to middle school Guidance office by March 22<sup>nd</sup>.
- 6. Student academic records and teacher recommendations are reviewed and students are placed into core academic programs in March May.
- 7. Students will receive course request verification for review and parent/guardian signature in June.
- 8. In late August, student schedules available on Genesis Parent Portal.
