Scheduling Procedures for Incoming 9th Grade Students

1. Parent Orientation meeting held in November to review high school program.
2. Presentation to 8th grade students in December to introduce students to the Academies and R.O.T.C.
3. High School counselor meets with students to review courses, programs, graduation requirements and scheduling process in February and March.
4. Jackson Academy applications (Digital Media, Business, STEM, JAA) notifications to students begin in March.
5. Students select World Language, two elective courses and two alternative courses on "Course Selection Sheets" and return to middle school Guidance office by March 22nd.
6. Student academic records and teacher recommendations are reviewed and students are placed into core academic programs in March - May.
7. Students will receive course request verification for review and parent/guardian signature in June.
8. In late August, student schedules available on Genesis Parent Portal.
