COMMUNITY

Jackson Township is located in the central part of New Jersey. It is a semi-rural community of 43,000 residents, 55 miles from New York City and 40 miles from Philadelphia. With an area of over 100 square miles, Jackson is the second largest township in the state of New Jersey.

JMHS is a four-year high school accredited by the New Jersey Department of Secondary Education.

SCHEDULING

Block scheduling was fully implemented in September, 1997. Our courses, with a few exceptions, are taught on a semester basis. A normal student schedule consists of four courses in the fall semester and four courses in the spring semester.

CURRICULUM

JMHS offers a fully diversified curriculum of over 180 courses in art, English, mathematics, music, communications, physical education, Air Force Jr. ROTC, science, social studies, world language, and vocational and technical fields. The latter are provided via a cooperative share-time program with the Ocean County Vocational-Technical Schools.

ACADEMIES

Jackson Memorial proudly offers four different academies to our students. We have the S.T.E.M Academy, (Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics), Jackson Academy of Business (J.A.B.), Jackson Arts Academy (J.A.A.), and the Digital Media Academy (D.M.A.). These academies are highly selective and require an application process.

HONORS PROGRAM

The purpose of the Honors Program is to provide students with an accelerated and expanded approach to the curriculum in the disciplines of English, mathematics, science, social studies, and world languages. Approximately 24 honor level courses are offered.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

JMHS is proud to offer its honor students an opportunity to gain college credits by enrolling in year-long Advanced Placement courses. The AP offerings for the 2022-2023 school year are as listed.

EARLY EXIT PROGRAM

Students who have completed their graduation requirements by the middle of their senior year are eligible to attend college in lieu of their second semester of their senior year.

EARLY COLLEGE PROGRAM

The Early College Program allows high-achieving students who are capable of meeting an increased challenge the opportunity to earn credit through Ocean County College. These students are registered for dual enrollment classes with ocean County College and Jackson School District.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

In addition to meeting an assessment requirement, all graduates of the Class of 2023 must successfully earn 130 credits:

4 courses each in English and Physical Education/Health,

3 courses in Mathematics,

3 courses in Science,

2 courses in U.S. History,

l course in World History,

2 courses in World Language,

1 computer-related course

1 course in Visual and Performing Arts

1 course in Financial Literacy and

1 course in 21st Century life and careers.

GRADING SYSTEM and CLASS RANK

- The numeric system is based on a 100 point scale.

- Advanced Placement (AP) classes will receive extra weight of 1.10 times the numeric grade.


