This letter explains the **production-coding** scheme that is used on frozen foodservice juice products. Our products are coded with the date of production. This is accomplished with the Julian date followed by the last digit of the year. The Julian production code is placed on all primary packages. The shipping box includes additional information: flavor, manufacturing site, and time of production.

Example production code: Apple D 2767 17:51


- 1. Apple Juice
- 2. Plant designation
 - a) $\mathbf{D} = \text{Deland}$, FL
 - b) E = Ellington, CT
 - c) N = Akron, OH
 - d) $\mathbf{H} = \text{Houston}, TX$
- 3. 276 = Julian date, October 3^{rd}
- 4.7 =Year (last digit), 2017
- 5. **17:51** = Military time, 5:51 PM

RE: Frozen Portion Fruit Juices produced by Country Pure Foods

Portion juices are single serve units ranging from 3 fl. oz. to 8 fl. oz in volume. Single serve portion juices have a shelf life of one year when stored frozen at 10°F or lower. Our juices should be thawed and stored under refrigeration (34°F to 38°F). For the best results, we recommend using all portion juices within 14 days from the initiation of thawing.
