Utilizing ARP funds, the Jackson School District has maintained full time guidance counselors in every classroom. All members (teachers, technicians, nurses and custodians) are being funded through ARP funds for the year. These are essential for lower class sizes to enhance instruction, attending to health needs in the school, providing technology devices for all staff and students and maintaining a clean environment.

Professional Development funded through ARP funding has been ongoing throughout the 23-24 school year.

Administrative input on our school plan is maintained on a continuous basis at monthly meetings with staff and local school committees. Our district DEAC committee meets on a monthly basis and provides input on the needs of the school district. We have public comment sessions at our monthly Board of Education meetings. Comments from parents pertaining to the school plans are reviewed with the Board and administrative team. Meetings with the Jackson Education Association monthly and discusses aspects of our school plan. Parent surveys have been utilized in the district plan and selecting school programs that have been offered to students every day. All of these inputs are taken into account with the return to school plan and any updates.
