

What Does Reader's Workshop Look Like?

- Start with a minilesson to model skill or strategy - Reading Bags: folder, notebook, post-its, bookmarks (do not go home at this time) - Independent reading while teacher conferences - Respond to literature: R (restate), A (answer), C (cite), E (example), S (sum it up) - Improvement in fluency, expression, comprehension, and even writing! Cross-curricular ties to Social Studies and Science

Unit 1: The Arc of Story (Writing Realistic Fiction - Narratives) Unit 2: Boxes and Bullets (Personal and Persuasive Essays - Opinion) Unit 3: Bringing History to Life (Informational) Unit 4: The Literary Essay (Writing About Fiction)

What Does Writer's Workshop Look Like?

- On-Demand Writing to begin each Unit

- Start with a minilesson to model skill or strategy

- Use Mentor Text to support the writing genre currently being worked on

Independent writing while teacher conferences with students

 Writing checklist and making goals throughout unit
 Go through writing process: planning/prewriting, drafting, revising (A.R.M.S.), editing (C.O.P.S.),

and **publishing**

- Some writing will be published handwritten and others on the Chromebook



- Students in groups based on developmental spelling stage
- 2 week cycle ALL introductions of new lists AND tests will be on the FRIDAY your child's group is in school
 - Scores reflect the student's ability to master <u>spelling</u> of the words and the ability to <u>sort</u> them using the pattern being taught

- A sentence will be given for grammar skills

 WTW work will be done at home for both Remote and In-person Days

- List in HW Folder, WTW Folder (notebook and pouch), posted assignments in Google Classroom, Spelling City




Grammar

Every Friday, whether In-Person or Remote

Topics will range from, but are not limited to... Parts of Speech (nouns, verbs, adjective, adverbs, pronouns) Types of Sentenes

(fragments, run-ons, statements, questions, commands, exclamatory) Capitalization Punctuation Dialogue

- At Elms Elementary School we used a standards based report card.

 Instead of receiving one grade for each subject, each subject is broken up into standards. (List of the the most important skills students should be learning in each subject)

ex: Math - Operations and Algebraic Thinking (Multiplication and Division), Fractions, Geometry, Measurements and Data.

 Parents can see exactly which skills their children are expected to learn and how well they are meeting that skills standard.



Standards Based Scoring

Progress Indicators: Academic Performance

4 – Exceeds Standards

Indicates the student consistently surpasses grade level standards. Performance is characterized by self-motivation and ability to apply these skills with consistent accuracy, independence, and high levels of quality and complexity.

3 – <u>Meets</u> Standards

Indicates the student <mark>consistently meets</mark> grade level standards. The student regularly demonstrates proficiency in the majority of grade level standards. The student, with limited errors, grasps and applies key concepts, processes, and skills for the current grade.

2 - Partially Meets Standards

Indicates the student occasionally meets the grade level standards. The student often needs teacher support to complete tasks. The student needs more time and instruction to develop skills.

1 – <u>Below</u> Standards

Indicates the student is not yet meeting grade level standards. The student demonstrates minimal understanding of concepts and skills. Performance is inconsistent with support and interventions.

NE – Not Evaluated

Indicates the standard was not evaluated.
