- 2. As you are reading be sure to use post-it notes, a journal, or a log to annotate areas when you stop, notice, and note a signpost in your book. When annotating, use the correct symbol to represent each signpost, include an explanation of what you noticed, answer the anchor question, and add the page #.
- 3. Create your "Mind Map" or "Chart" to display your signposts. (See directions for each attached)
- 4. Plan a brief presentation of your project for the class.

Guidelines for the "Mind Map"

- 1. You will need to create a map that is mostly hand drawn and colored, covering the entire poster board which includes the **book title**, the **author**, **your name**, a **focal point illustration**, **roads or paths**, and a **background**.
- 2. Think of a picture that represents your book to use as a focal point on your **poster**. Then think of something you can use to create your paths or roads.
- 3. Select 4 signposts from your reading to include on your map. You should 4 different signposts on your "Mind Map." Each signpost symbol should be written on your poster and include the all the annotations nearby. Each signpost should include (1) the signpost symbol, (2) the page #, (3) what you noticed, and (4) a response to the anchor question. (Please view the sample on classpage and Google classroom for how to construct your "What I Noticed" and "Response to Anchor Question" responses.
- 4. As with all projects, NO pencil should be used on the final product and your completed "Mind Map" should be neat, organized and colorful. !!!
- 5. Be creative and design your map thoughtfully!!!

Guidelines for the "Chart"

- 1. Select 8 of the signposts you identified during your reading to include in your chart. You should have at least one of each signpost with two repeated for a total of 8 signposts. (if you are unable to find all 6, you may choose one signpost to skip, but you must then repeat another for a total of 8)
- 2. You must **TYPE** the signpost responses. This worksheet/template is available on Google classroom.
- 3. All columns must be completed for each signpost, including (1) the signpost symbol, (2) page #, (3) what you noticed, and (4) a response to the anchor question. (Please view the sample on classpage and Google classroom of how to construct your "What I Noticed" and "Response to Anchor Question" responses.
- 4. Remember to proofread your work. Capitalization, spelling, and grammar all count.
- 5. Your completed "Chart" should be completed and turned in as a Doc on the Google Classroom.
