Library Resources for Teachers and Students

- <u>Digital Library cards</u>: We are currently issuing temporary digital library cards to customers.
 - o <u>Fill out the library card application form</u> and applicants will be emailed a library barcode that can be used with any of our databases and resources.

 (A valid email address is necessary.)
 - What you need to Know: We will make it possible for teachers to pick up the cards from the Jackson Children's Department to hand out to students in class or at the end of the year. - <u>Educator Cards</u>: We now have educator cards available for teachers in Ocean County.
 - o Educator Cardholders are able to:
 - Borrow up to 50 items
 - Request up to 50 items
 - Check out books, audiobooks, and non-fiction DVDs for a loan period of 40 days
 - Check out Feature Films (DVD and Blu-ray) for a loan period of 7 days
 - Access OCL's hundreds of <u>electronic resource databases</u>
 - Download and stream <u>Digital Materials</u>: eBooks, eMagazines, audiobooks, newspapers, streaming video, and music
 - Apply for Educator card: You can either print and bring this form into the Jackson branch or print, scan and email the form to us (Note: The applicant must provide a valid school ID for a Pre-K 12 school as well as one (1) of the following: valid employment contract OR letter of request on school letterhead.)
 - Educator cards are valid through June 30th of the current school year, if you already received a card last year you will need to renew for the current school year. To renew privileges, present the same documentation provided for initial registration.

- <u>Digital Materials:</u> we have a great selection of digital materials available from several platforms—including audiobooks, eBooks (even graphic novels!), magazines, and more that all can be accessed for free with a library card.
